WHAT HAS BEEN DONE

- The Conference will be held at the Columbia Marriott Hotel and Conference Center
- The Logo and Theme has been approved by AACPM
- The proposed Budget and Registration Fees has been forwarded to AACPM for review.
- The hotel room fee is \$85.00 plus tax which equates to \$94.35. This may change as per diem rates may change on October 1, 2012 that are published by GSA
